Grants. The Heritage Centre Group have been very fortunate to have been awarded several grants towards the setting up and running of the Centre.

- 1. Grant of £868 awarded in August 2011 by Milngavie Community Council for a set of 8 display boards which were in use for our September 2011 Exhibitions.
- 2. Grant of £2140 awarded in March 2012 by ED Community Grant Scheme towards a set of 8 wall mounted display cases for September 2012 and future Exhibitions.
- 3. Grant of £500 awarded in March 2012 by East Dunbartonshire Arts Council for the design and printing of 1 display roll up banner for future Exhibition.
- 4. Grant of £2000 awarded in June 2012 by Glasgow Airport Flight Path for 2 roll up banners, 3 wall mounted cupboards below the wall mounted display cases and 1 vertical glass free-standing showcaae. (See Award Photo Below).
- 5. Grant of £1340 awarded in November 2012 by ED Community Grants Scheme for preparation and running costs towards the March 2013 Exhibition.

September 2012 Events.

Doors Open Day. The Heritage Centre was open to visitors on Doors Open Day, Saturday 8th September, with a first showing of the photographic display on 'Buildings of Milngavie'. This was also the first opportunity to see the display cases fully loaded with objects, some of them donated or loaned by Milngavie residents, others loaned by East Dunbartonshire Leisure & Culture Trust. There were 3 guided walks from the Centre on Doors Open Day.

'Buildings of Milngavie Exhibition'. The fully-developed version of the exhibition was on show at the Centre on Fri 28th Sep, Sat 29th Sep and Mon 1st Oct. Specially featured were the buildings of John Woodburn, whose vision developed Milngavie from a self-contained manufacturing community to an extremely attractive place to live, popular with commuters travelling to Glasgow city centre each day. The exhibition was well attended, including several class visits by local primary schools.

Report on Band Concert.

On Monday 29th October, the Heritage Centre Group held its first fund-raising concert. This took the form of a happy celebration with local Big Band "Monday Swing". From the band's perspective, this was the third in an annual series of autumn performances in Milngavie Town Hall, the previous two in association with Milngavie Book and Art Festival. Monday Swing, formed in 1984 as an offshoot of the Dunbartonshire Wind Ensemble, are amateur musicians who meet to rehearse and perform music of the kind introduced by the likes of Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Benny Goodman and Glen Miller. A large enthusiastic audience enjoyed their "Evening of Big Band Jazz" spiced with vocals by John Gourlay.

During the interval, audience members were able to visit the Heritage Centre, which was filled as perhaps never before, and undoubtedly widened its outreach. Fund-raising was augmented by a raffle organised by MHC committee members. The proceeds from the ticket sales and raffle after deducting expenses have been divided between the Heritage Centre, and the Dunbartonshire Wind Ensemble Trust, (over 400 pounds each). The funds from the latter group are used to help schoolchildren living in Dunbartonshire and the Glasgow area to play in a community wind band outside school hours under the musical direction of professional musicians.

Local History Week 2013 Exhibition.

Milngavie Heritage Centre's main contribution to Scottish Local History Week in early March will be an exhibition on 'Fountains & Fields', dealing with all aspects of the use of water in Milngavie but especially the Waterworks, the use of Allander water for powering mills and manufactories, and John Woodburn's Tannoch Loch hydro-electric scheme. The exhibition will run from Tues 5th to Sat 9th March, open 10.00am – 5.00pm each day.
